## **ACTIVITY SHEET**


Charles M. Russell (1864–1926) was a renowned artist and storyteller of the Old West who called Central Montana home. Russell's artwork portrays the daily life of the range cowboy and the Plains Indian, the monumental landscapes of the Montana wilderness and its sovereign inhabitants - the bison, elk, bear and wolf all reflected through the artist's personal experience during the closing days of the western frontier. Russell's whimsical side is revealed in tiny, playful figures of gnomes, elves and caricatures fashioned out of clay, wax, plaster and bark. Step back in time as you view Charlie's works and imagine what life was like in Montana during his lifetime.
